## The streets of Hetsugi



The town was considered a key junction of traffic along Ohno River on Hyuga Highway. It retains the historical ambience of the Edo era.

## ③ Hoashi Honke Sake Brewery



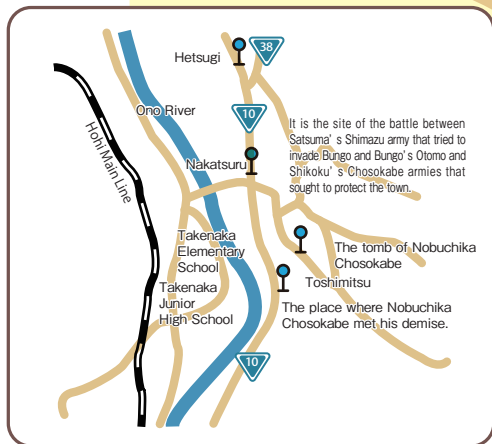
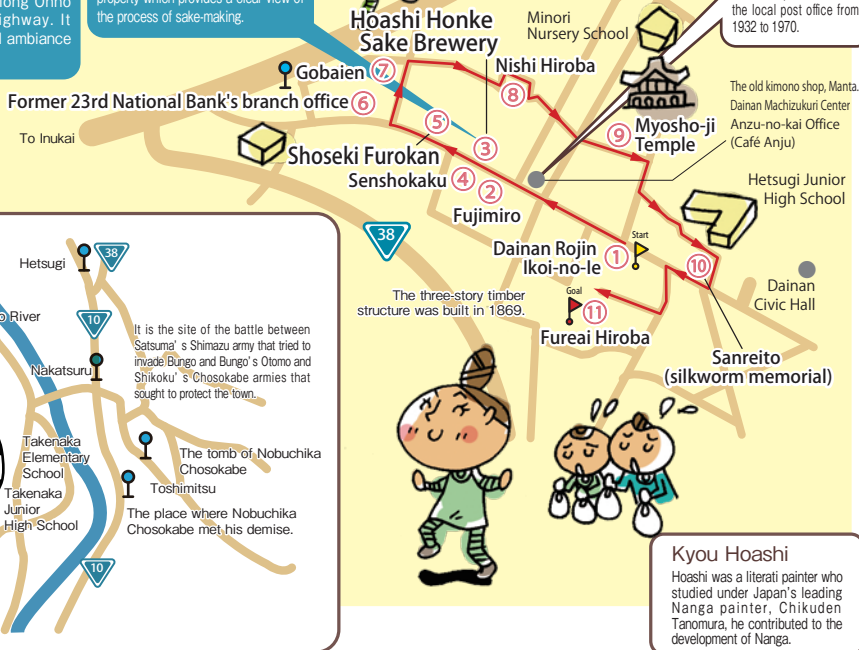
The brewery was built from the mid-Edo to Meiji period, and it produced sake until 1972. It is now Oita City's designated tangible cultural property which provides a clear view of the process of sake-making.



## Dainan Machizukuri Center



The manor house of the former lord of the Kumamoto Domain in Tsurusaki was relocated in 1906 and used as a kimono shop. After a partial conversion, it was used as the local post office from 1932 to 1970.
